## Thank You From Our Crescendo Violinists!

Late last year, so many of you generously responded to our call out for support with purchasing violins for the students in our free music education program, Crescendo, in Kwinana. Crescendo started as a vocal-based program in 2014, encouraging students to use their in-built instrument and help 'give them a voice', and the results we have seen since have been impressive and heartwarming. Crescendo is modelled on the international El Sistema program, which has a proven record of improving behaviour, numeracy, literacy, social skills and fine motor skills, as well as lowering truancy and youth violence in disadvantaged communities.

After three full years of program delivery, we are now excited to enter the second phase with the introduction of string instruments for the Year 4's at Medina Primary and North Parmelia Primary Schools. The violin program has now officially kicked off with your help through the purchase of the first **116** violins for our Crescendo students!



All current Year 4 students, and many Year 3's, have been working towards achieving their Violin Licence in their Crescendo music lessons by receiving 5 gold stars across a range of musical and behavioural learning areas. Our Crescendo Teaching Team are super proud of the students' achievements, and look forward to working with instrumental teachers at the Department of Education Instrumental Music School Services (IMSS) to deliver this important next stage in our program.

The first big batch of violins ranging in sizes from ¼, ½ and ¾ were recently delivered to the WASO office, and in anticipation of this major step in our program, Cassandra Lake, our Executive, Manager, Community Engagement, consulted widely with musicians and other colleagues on the "right" violin for our participants. Graeme Norris, WASO's Principal 1st Violin, is a distributor when not playing in the Orchestra, and he worked with Cassandra to order our first shipment of instruments.

In sourcing violins for beginners, the goal is to balance easy playing, a nice sound, and great value for those starting out on the instrument. It can be a challenge to find the right balance in a student model instrument, and the Eurostring violins chosen by us come set up by a professional luthier, so students can learn all the correct playing habits from the beginning of their instrumental music journey. Crescendo is delivered by WASO at no cost to these two schools in Kwinana, and provides weekly music lessons at school as well as the opportunity to enjoy WASO performances at Perth Concert Hall and at local venues in Kwinana. By 2020 all students across both schools will be involved in WASO's Crescendo program. This means that Crescendo is continually evolving, with new Pre-Primary students joining each year, and we therefore have a continuing need to purchase violins. ## Full Circle Philanthropy: A commission with a surprise!



On 17 November last year, many of you would have made their way to Perth Concert Hall for yet another night of symphonic delights, but one of you (a very special WASO Patron) was heading into the Hall not knowing what was in store that night.

On the night of WASO performing the world premiere of Paul Stanhope's brand new Trombone Concerto, Dr Glenda Campbell-Evans was looking forward to hearing WASO's Principal Trombone, Josh Davis, proving his virtuosity in this exciting new premiere. Glenda and her husband, Dr Ken Evans, have a keen interest in this particular instrument and purchased a new trombone for WASO's Instrument Fund a few years back. What she did not know, is that Ken had commissioned this new Trombone Concerto as a surprise for her on the occasion of a special birthday! So it was not until Executive Manager of Artistic Planning, Evan Kennea, and the composer Paul Stanhope himself entered the stage, and the spotlight suddenly turned on Ken and Glenda, that she realised what a huge surprise she was in for!

Glenda is a much loved Patron of our Orchestra, who is not only sitting on the Patrons & Friends Committee, but is also the face of our bequest program. Ken is also a wonderful supporter in his own right and thought it would be a marvellous idea to take their support of the trombone to the next level by commissioning a work especially written for the trombone, as they felt it was an instrument that rarely received the level of attention it deserves. Ken's conversations with the WASO Philanthropy team started in 2015, and the rest, as they say, is history.

Philanthropy team had a lot of fun keeping this very special surprise for Glenda secret! Luckily, Paul Stanhope and Josh Davis had the opportunity to work together on this commission very closely throughout the whole process - which is a rare luxury and we were very happy to hear that Paul later commented that working with Josh, Asher Fisch and the WASO on this commission felt like 'a Rolls Royce experience'!

If you as the reader now wonder 'what next'... you are actually spot on! As a terrific after-note to this beautiful project, Ken and Glenda have recently notified us that they have decided to support an Orchestral Chair, namely the position of Principal Trombone that Josh is occupying, to further deepen their understanding of the instrument, learn more about the life of an orchestral musician and deepen their personal connection with the musician of their choice. A fantastic commitment that surely will see their involvement with the Orchestra grow further, and goes to show just how many different forms philanthropy at WASO can take!

On behalf of everyone at WASO, a big thank you to Ken and Glenda for their continued love of WASO, and for being such fun supporters to work with! We hope they will continue to enjoy the amazing composition that is their very own Trombone Concerto in the comfort of their home via recording and printed score.

## The Will Of Music: In Memoriam Kwok Paul (Poh) Lee



The WASO Philanthropy team often talks amongst themselves about how lucky we are to have such a loyal and committed community of supporters. Our WASO Patrons, Friends and Bequestors (all of you!) continue to show us year in, year out, just how much orchestral music means to you. It is not often, however that a member of our team receives a phone call about a major legacy gift, as happened to our Planned Giving Manager, Sarah Tompkin, last year when the

executor of late Patron, Dr Paul Lee made contact. To her surprise, Sarah was notified that the unspecified bequest Paul had left to the Orchestra amounted to nothing less than \$750,000 - a remarkable and truly generous gift that will play an important role in growing WASO's Endowment Fund.

Paul, who was a much loved part of the WASO Philanthropy community, had been a subscriber for over twenty years, and played an active part in WASO Philanthropy since 2008. The Philanthropy team always loved knowing that for every Masters concert he would sit in his seat -S10 in the Front Stalls - and get absorbed in and carried away by whatever works we were performing on stage that night. He took part in many Patrons & Friends events over the years and was a popular, if quiet, part of our philanthropic community. In 2012, he joined our Renaissance Tours group to explore the best Scandinavian orchestras in Norway and Iceland.

Paul studied dentistry and orthodontics at Adelaide University and successfully practiced as an orthodontist in South Perth until the last year of his life. His great loves, apart from his profession, were his Siamese cats, his Citröen, his enviable collection of musical recordings and cooking healthy, tasty food. Paul was deeply committed environmentally and a keen conservationist who loved and spent much time in the Australian bush. He enjoyed extended bush walks through Karijini National Park and the Flinders Ranges throughout his life.

We fondly and gratefully remember Paul as a humble, humorous, and kind man who has made a lasting statement about what mattered to him. Bequests like Paul's - no matter their size or shape - will play an expanding role in WASO's future in enabling us to secure stability in a time when public funding is limited. WASO will be increasingly reliant on the income stream generated through its Endowment Fund for the Orchestra - something that Paul was acutely aware of.

Monies from bequests to WASO are invested and preserved in the Endowment Fund and the income earned, less inflation, is used to support WASO's activities for many years into the future. This means that our bequestors' monies live on forever, providing support for the development of young artists, regional touring, the commissioning of new musical works and WASO's award-winning Education & Community Engagement programs.

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## An Evening of Art with Janet Holmes à Court and Brent Grapes



Our first Patrons & Friends event for 2018, held on Monday 19 February, was a great success with 80 guests attending a special exhibition of the Janet Holmes à Court art collection and hearing from 2017 Friends of WASO Scholarship recipient and Principal Trumpet, Brent Grapes\*.

WASO Chairman (at the time of writing) and Patron, Janet Holmes à Court, introduced the story of her art collection, some of which is now on display at Perth Concert Hall - what a fascinating story it is! Commencing in the 1960's, she and her late husband, Robert, purchased some paintings and over the years, 'bitten by the bug', Janet has built the collection to some 5,000 pieces.

Together with her Exhibitions Manager, Sharon Tassicker, Janet spoke of her special interest in aboriginal art, particularly the fine Batik works produced by the Utopian women in extraordinarily limited conditions. These pieces have been toured around the world and are currently displayed at Perth Concert Hall, alongside a collection of wonderful paintings by Peter Skipper. Janet generously shares her larger collection of works with many galleries and has made a significant contribution to the promotion of indigenous works far and wide.

Moving to the music side of the evening, Brent Grapes, who recently returned from his visit to the Juilliard School in New York where he previously spent two years studying, was interviewed by Janet Holmes à Court. Brent was thrilled to be able to return to New York last year with the assistance of the Friends of WASO Scholarship, to meet with old friends and former professors (some of whom had written the text books he originally studied from at UWA) and engage in professional development opportunities. Brent also acknowledged the generous gift of four trumpets to WASO from two Patrons, John Albright and Susan Lorimer, and spoke about these different trumpets providing varying colour to the music.

Brent, accompanied on piano by Graeme Gilling, entertained the audience with John Williams' *With Malice toward None* from the film Lincoln. Following this, Brent demonstrated the Piccolo Trumpet by playing *Prelude to Te Deum* by Marc-Antoine Charpentier. Janet concluded the interview by sharing the story of Brent seeing WASO as a schoolboy and deciding then and there that he would play the trumpet. We are so lucky to have such a talented Perth musician now leading the WASO trumpet section.

The event was a marvellous cultural blend and concluded with guests enjoying a glass of wine and some snacks, beautifully created by Patrons & Friends Committee members, Chris Rtshiladze and Jennifer Gardiner. It was wonderful to see Patrons, Friends and WASO staff catching up with each other after a long summer break.
