

PROFESSIONAL PATHWAYS

MUSIC FOR LIFE



SIDE-BY-SIDE

Through industry leading partnerships with the Australian National Academy of Music (ANAM), the Western Australian Youth Orchestra (WAYO) and UWA Conservatorium of Music, WASO delivers in-depth development programs and performs side-by-side with young musicians on the mainstage to strengthen the future of music across the country.

In 2023, ANAM students joined WASO for a rare opportunity to perform Act I of Richard Wagner's epic opera, *Die Walküre*, and in 2024 they join a colossal mainstage line-up to perform Mahler's Eighth Symphony.

BEHIND THE BATON

2024 sees WASO continue to nurture the next generation of conducting talent in Australia. WASO is excited to work alongside the other major Australian orchestras for another year of the **Australian Conducting Academy**, delivering opportunities and masterclasses for aspiring conductors to learn from experienced orchestral leaders. WASO 2022-23 **Assistant Conductor** Jen Winley's star also continues to rise, as she makes her MACA Classics series debut with *Scheherazade* (page 7 and page 9).

SHARING NEW MUSIC

Composition Project offers emerging Australian composers the opportunity to develop their skills in a professional environment, with the program generating a series of world premiere compositions each year. Guided through lessons, workshops and rehearsals, participants compose works for 14-piece chamber ensemble, cumulating in a live debut performance by WASO musicians.

Graduates from the program have gone on to gain placements in national and international composition programs and attain professional commissions and residencies. Winner of Composition Project 2023, Nicholas Kyriakacis will compose a new work for WASO's family concert, Classic Adventures: Wild Animals in 2024.

FOR THE YOUNG...

WASO's flagship music education program **Crescendo** delivers 1,700 music lessons annually to students across two Kwinana schools from Pre-Primary to Year 6. The program begins its eleventh year of commitment to music education in WA in 2024, continuing to provide weekly lessons in musicianship to all students, and lessons in violin, string ensemble, choir and cello.

Crescendo students also participate in the schools mass choir event, One Big Voice bi-annually, most recently in 2023; "In order to take part in the event, the students consistently need to display exemplary behaviour and it was astounding to watch this boy become what I can only describe as a little superstar. His performance and behaviour earned him a spot in the group selected to travel to the event, and it was at this point that the reality of what this program means to children at a school like ours really came home to me." – Karen Davey, Principal, Medina Primary School

Meanwhile WASO musicians travel regularly across Perth to nursing homes and aged care settings, bringing the joy of live music to people who may be unable to attend an event at Perth Concert Hall. **Music For The Ages** performances see WASO musicians share stories about life working in an orchestra, the history of the music and performance excerpts.

MUSIC FOR EVERYONE

Disability organisations throughout Perth receive regular invitations to WASO's Connect program at Perth Concert Hall. Rehearsal viewings and bespoke chamber concerts provide unique experiences for people living with a disability and their carers. WASO also works with the School of Special Education Needs: Medical and Mental Health (SSEN:MMH) at Perth Children's Hospital to ensure that young music lovers who are unable to attend WASO performances in person can still experience the power of music through the Hospital Orchestra Project (HOP). WASO musicians present a range of performances and participatory music events, alongside visits to individuals in classrooms and wards, bringing emotionally supportive experiences and the benefits of music to children and adolescents in hospital.

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
YOUR STATE ORCHESTRA

WASO ON THE ROAD

As the State Orchestra, WASO takes pride in creating, curating and presenting high quality musical and entertainment experiences for the enjoyment of all West Australians. In 2023 WASO hit the road, accompanied for the first time by a contemporary artist, WA hip-hop legend Drapht. The MC and the orchestra blew the roof off three performances in Kalgoorlie and Karratha, giving audiences in these regions a unique opportunity to see another side of orchestral music. Schools and communities in Dampier, Karratha, Kalgoorlie-Boulder,

Geraldton and Bunbury were also able to experience performances from WASO ensembles. 2023 marks WASO's biggest year of regional touring to date, with the orchestra also performing classical concerts in Albany, Bunbury and Mandurah.

In outer metropolitan Perth, from Kalamunda to Kallaroo and Medina to Marangaroo, WASO Community Ensembles perform to over 5,000 people annually.



SHARING STORIES

WASO is proud to work with the country's finest First Nations artists to share stories of Australia through original compositions and reinterpretations of existing music. 2023 saw the orchestra perform with composer, producer and multi-instrumentalist William Barton to present his work, *Apii Thatini Mu Murtu* (To sing and carry a coolamon on country together). In 2024, WASO's mainstage season opens with the orchestra performing

The Coming Dawn by Noongar musician Aaron Wyatt, who will also conduct the work.

As WASO commence our 'Innovate' Reconciliation Action Plan, our journey of learning and listening continues as our collaborations with First Nations artists strengthen and evolve.

SCHOOL BOOKINGS are processed in order of receipt. We encourage bookings to be submitted online, via email or posted.

ONE FREE EDUCATOR TICKET will be made available for every 10 (primary) or 15 (secondary) student tickets purchased. Additional teacher/supervisor tickets can be purchased. Please indicate the number of educator tickets required as part of your booking.

TRANSACTION FEE OF \$6.90 will apply to each school booking form received and this will be included in your order confirmation.

CONFIRMATION OF BOOKING will be provided to you within one week of receipt. Orders are not final until payment is received, free events excepted. The confirmation will include details on how to make a payment. You can pay at any time up to 10 days prior to the event.

GROUP SIZES may change up until 14 days prior to each event. After this date all orders must be paid as issued. Paid incursions are subject to a minimum of 200 students per performance.

PAYMENT can be made at any time after receipt of your order confirmation. Final payment is required at least 10 days prior to each event. Please note all school bookings made within 3 weeks of an event are final, after they are confirmed, and must be paid for in full within 1 week of confirmation.

CANCELLATIONS of any school booking will be accepted 6 weeks before the event with an exchange or full refund. Only reasonable group size changes will be accepted thereafter.
